Endnote Users Special Note

For those of you publishing in Demography or utilizing the Demography journal reference style, the style is out of date in Endnote. The journal Demography switched publishers beginning with the 2011 volume and changed the reference style used in the journal from the American Sociological Association (ASA) citation style to the American Psychological Association (APA) citation style. Fortunately, Endnote comes with the APA 6th edition citation style and can be easily selected for preparing manuscripts to send to the journal Demography.
